WHEN IS THE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES?

September 3rd 2019. Day after Labor Day.



HOW MUCH IS TUITION AND HOW DO I PAY?

Tuition and other fees can be paid at the main office, by phone, or online through your self service banner. Tuition fees can also be paid through your student loan.

WHEN DO I REGISTER?

Online registration is open from July 30-Aug 10th. You will be mailed a registration package with information on registration dates, school start, costs, and tool list. You will need to complete an online check-in once you arrive on campus.

CAN I GET A STUDENT LOAN TO GO TO SCHOOL? IS THERE OTHER FUNDING?

I HAD EXTRA SUPPORTS IN HIGH SCHOOL CAN I GET SUPPORT AT COLLEGE?

Yes. If you are a student with a disability and you will require services and supports from Accessibility Services, start the application process early. If you indicated on your application that you are an applicant with a documented disability, you will be contacted by the Accessibility Services Coordinator to start this process. Early planning can help you avoid any delays in starting your program or in accessing the services and supports you will need. If, for example, you require adaptive equipment, alternate format texts or interpreting services, at least three months notice may be needed to ensure availability at the start of your program.

The Accessibility Services Coordinator (ASC) will review your documentation and discuss with you the accommodations you can avail of in your college program. With a few exceptions, such as personal care, one on one instruction, modified outcomes, etc., you will have access to the accommodations appropriate for your disability. Depending on your high school, the accommodations may look a little different in college. For example, if you qualify for a reader, you will use assistive technology such as Kurzweil or if you qualify for a scribe, you will use a program called Dragon Naturally Speaking. When you disclose early, the ASC will discuss the accommodations in college with you so you are familiar with our process before your program starts.

IS THERE A LOT OF BOOK WORK THAT NEEDS TO BE DONE WITH A TRADES PROGRAM?

Yes, there is a significant amount of book work that needs to be completed. There is about half classroom theory and related course work and about half hands on shop training in most of our trades programs. In addition to completing theory you will also do courses in math, communications, computers, workplace essentials, etc. The pass mark for all course is 70%. Students are allowed two rewrites per semester (one for intercession) if they meet certain conditions.

DO I HAVE TO PAY THE HEALTH AND DENTAL FEE?

College of the North Atlantic is pleased to offer full-time students with a health and dental insurance plan. This plan is mandatory for full-time students enrolled in a college program for 15 weeks or more in the academic year. With this plan, students will have access to drug,



extended medical and dental insurance coverage. Qualified students are automatically charged for this coverage. If you do not want this insurance, it is your responsibility as a student to decline the coverage through the Student Self Service portal

Only students who provide proof of alternate health and dental coverage will be allowed to opt out during the enrollment period. Also, students have the option to add family coverage (spouse/partner and dependents) during the enrollment period or before these deadline dates: Oct 1st, 2019.

HOW DO I OPT OUT OF THE COLLEGE'S HEALTH AND DENTAL PLAN?

The college offers a Health and Dental plan that is compulsory for full time students enrolled in a program of fifteen (15) weeks or longer. All students "must" indicate their intention for the Health and Dental plan (eg: opting out or enrollment in single or family coverage). Your Health and Dental options must be completed online via self service as soon as possible to ensure the proper fees are calculated on your student financial account. Please log into Student Self Service and use the following navigation to make the necessary selections to your health and dental coverage: Self Service > Health Dental Plan Options.

Note: If you want to opt out, you will need to provide existing proof of coverage (ie: policy number, insurance provider and plan member/Policy holder) when completing the online opt out request.

Failure to update your health and dental options during the health and dental enrollment period will result in an automatic enrollment in single health and single dental and the applicable fees will be assessed to your student financial account.

These need to be completed before you will be allowed in the shops. We suggest you not buy your tools until you have met with your instructor to determine when they will be needed.

WHERE DO I GO IF I NEED A COPY OF MY TRANSCRIPT?

STUDENT COUNCIL

Each campus will have a student representative council. Members will be needed again this year and are an integral part of student life on campus. You are encouraged to be a part of the campus student council, (CNASU).

I HAVE SOME COURSES COMPLETED. HOW CAN I GET AN EXEMPTION?

Students will need to fill out an exemption form with proof of completion and your instructor will determine if an exemption can be granted. You may be able to receive an exemption from the first semester math (AM1100) following the successful completion of the ACCUPLACER. This ACCUPLACER testing will take place the first week of school.

A student who can meet the mathematics requirement through an ACUPLACER® test may be exempted from AM1100 - Math Essentials.

IS THE COLLEGE SCENT-FREE?

IS THE COLLEGE SMOKE-FREE?

As of September 1, 2010, College of the North Atlantic expanded its Smoke Free Workplace Program to no longer allow smoking on any property operated by College of the North Atlantic. This includes all campuses, field sites and buildings, office buildings, learning centres, and parking lots and grounds.

HOW DO I GET A LOCKER AT THE CAMPUS?

Lockers are provided by College of the North Atlantic, Placentia Campus, and will be assigned to students after classes begin in September. Students must provide their own combination locks. The locker is assigned to that student for the duration of the study period as per policies outlined in the Locker Use Agreement.

WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY A RED SEAL PROGRAM AND APPRENTICESHIP?

For Red Seal programs such as Millwright, Machinist and Heavy Duty Equipment Technician/TTM you will work through an apprenticeship program and block levels until you reach journeyperson status. Following the completion of your first year training and when you secure employment in your trade area you will then register with Industrial Training as an apprentice and start a log book. You will be required to complete a certain number of hours of work to advance through the apprenticeship blocks. Each block requires work hours and advanced training and a block exam (between 6 - 8 weeks of advanced school training per block). Following the successful completion of all blocks, a journeyperson exam can be written. After successfully passing this exam (70% needed) you will receive a Red Seal endorsement and your qualifications will be recognized nationally – Interprovincial Certification. Apprenticeship training can range from 1-5 years with the average being 4 (7200 hours of work /school experience required to write Interprovincial red Seal Exam).
