Identification Definitions:

Indigenous: a collective name for the original peoples of North America and their descendants. The Canadian Constitution recognizes 3 groups of Indigenous peoples: First Nations, Inuit, and Métis.

Racialized Group: a category of people who are perceived and treated differently based on race or ethnicity.

2SLGBTQI+: an acronym standing for the categories of two-spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer (a self-identifying term used in some gay communities) or questioning, Intersex, and additional people who identify as part of sexual and gender diverse communities.

Female: all people who identify as female, whether they are cisgender or transgender female.

Disability: any impairment, including a physical, mental, intellectual, cognitive, learning, communication or sensory impairment or a functional limitation that restricts your ability to perform the daily activities.

Permanent Resident of Newfoundland and Labrador: a person who has resided in the province for more than 12 months prior to starting college and who is not an international student or visitor to the province.
