Number of Awards:	Four (one each for four geographic region)
Value:	\$1000 each
Criteria:	Awarded to a full-time student enrolled in the second year or greater of any diploma or degree program. Students must demonstrate academic merit, financial need, a commitment to completing their studies, and community/college involvement. Special consideration may be given to students who:

- a) Can demonstrate an affiliation with the credit union system and/or
- b) Are members from traditionally underrepresented communities.

Geographic locations are defined as:

Central: Bonavista, Burin, Clarenville, Gander, Grand Falls – Windsor Eastern: Carbonear, Placentia, Seal Cove, St. John's (Prince Philip Drive, Ridge Road) Western: Bay St. George, Corner Brook, Port aux Basques, St. Anthony Labrador: Happy Valley-Goose Bay, Labrador West

Application must include:

- Credit Unions Bursaries Application
- College Financial Statement
- College Reference Form
- A brief essay (two pages maximum) describing the applicant's educational goals, career aspirations and community involvement activities.

Identification Definitions:

Indigenous: a collective name for the original peoples of North America and their descendants. The Canadian Constitution recognizes 3 groups of Indigenous peoples: First Nations, Inuit, and Métis.

Racialized Group: a category of people who are perceived and treated differently based on race or ethnicity.

2SLGBTQI+: an acronym standing for the categories of two-spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer (a selfidentifying term used in some gay communities) or questioning, Intersex, and additional people who identify as part of sexual and gender diverse communities.

Female: all people who identify as female, whether they are cisgender or transgender female.

Disability: any impairment, including a physical, mental, intellectual, cognitive, learning, communication or sensory impairment or a functional limitation that restricts your ability to perform the daily activities.

Permanent Resident of NL: a person who has resided in the province for more than 12 months prior to starting college and who is not an international student or visitor to the province.
