Criteria: Awarded to a first year full time registered student (female or Indigenous) in the following skilled trades apprenticeship programs: Baking & Pastry Arts, Carpenter, Construction/Industrial Electrician, Cook, Heavy Duty Equipment Technician/ Truck & Transport Mechanic, Industrial Mechanic (Millwright), Instrumentation and Control Technician, Machinist, Mobile Crane Operator, Plumber, Refrigeration & Air Conditioning Mechanic, Sheet Metal Worker, Steamfitter/ Pipefitter, Welder or Welder/ Metal Fabricator (Fitter) programs. This award is based on financial need, academic merit, and reference.

Note: \$4000.00 for block training will be divided evenly among the number of blocks for the specific program. The successful recipient is required to contact the Alumni and Advancement Office (CNA) once for each block of training is completed. Documentation will be required to receive the additional block funding. ***Please note:** For programs that do not have specific block training, the additional \$4000 will be issued upon receiving Red Seal certifications. You must documentation to the Alumni & Advancement Office directly.*

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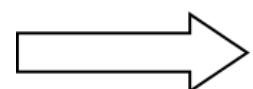
